In the GA Level 3 Sustainable Wildlife Conservation and Biodiversity Management, Learners will understand how soil is the basis for all wildlife conservation and how vegetation, the soil and the climate all have implications for wildlife conservation and biodiversity. Learners will also be provided with an understanding of the ecological concepts and functions important to conservation, the role of biodiversity and how it can be managed, including the methods and techniques used to sustainably manage wildlife populations. In addition, learners will also develop an understanding of the concept of the biodiversity-based economy and how this can contribute to addressing modern global challenges related to socio-economics.
